- A digital reporting and alerting system and screening tools
- On- and offline sex worker-only spaces
- Affirming, sex worker-friendly mental health support services
- Safety information, advocacy, community education, and sex worker-centred community-based research

17th December 2022 marks the 19th International Day To End Violence Against Sex Workers (IDEVASW), where sex workers and allies across the world come together to mourn, honour and pay respects to those we have lost.

At NUM, our mission is to end all forms of violence against sex workers. This does not just include interpersonal violence. The conditions which exclude sex workers from society, which prevent them from achieving justice, which keep their voices suppressed, have to end. In the face of the current cost of living crisis and continued attempts to introduce legislation and policy which makes sex workers even more vulnerable to harm, this is more important than ever. Without this, the stigma and discrimination which allows this violence to occur will persist. All forms of oppression must all be eradicated if we are to achieve justice for sex workers, and for all of us.

As always, we invite you to say their names with us, but we also ask you to do more: Listen to sex workers. Support and uplift their voices. Donate. Refuse to stay silent in the face of injustice. Work with sex workers to eliminate the social conditions and the harmful policies that limit their lives. Only then will the violence cease.
